Availability of "No Objection Certificate (NOC) Issued in Lieu of Migration and Transfer Certificates" on the Student Dashboard

References:

To facilitate students wishing to pursue two full-time academic programs simultaneously, Veer Narmad South Gujarat University (VNSGU) proactively discontinued the issuance of Transfer and Migration Certificates. The measure that allows students to secure admission at another Higher Education Institution (HEI) without having to leave VNSGU. Anticipating the administrative hurdles students would face, VNSGU implemented this facilitative policy well before the University Grants Commission (UGC) issued specific directives addressing the issue. The UGC later validated this foresight in its letter dated 20th November 2024. In it, the UGC noted that despite multiple reminders spanning over two years, several HEIs continue to insist on migration or school leaving certificates—a practice that, as the UGC explicitly highlights, limits students' ability to secure concurrent admissions and directly undermines the very purpose of the guidelines.

To resolve the ongoing difficulties students face during the admission process, the University has developed a streamlined solution:

- **Introduction of the NOC:** The University has created a "No Objection Certificate (NOC) in Lieu of Migration and Transfer Certificates".
- **Purpose of the Document:** This NOC explicitly states that VNSGU has no objection to a student joining any other university or HEI for further studies, whether by migrating entirely or by engaging in simultaneous studies following UGC norms.

Process to Obtain the No Objection Certificate (NOC) Issued in Lieu of Migration and Transfer Certificates:

Student can apply for and generate this NOC directly through your student dashboard by following these steps:

1. Log in to **vnsгу.net** using your **SPID**.
2. Navigate to the "**College/Department Management**" menu.
3. Go to "**Migration**" and click on "**Download No Objection Certificate (Issued in Lieu of Migration and Transfer Certificates)**".

Important Instructions for Students:

Any student who is being asked to provide a migration certificate, transfer certificate, or both by another university should first produce the public notice issued by this University, which clearly states that the issuance of these certificates has been discontinued.

If the requesting university or college still insists on a migration certificate, transfer certificate, or both, even after producing the public notice, you can log in to your dashboard following the steps above and generate this NOC. This NOC explicitly covers the content and message traditionally conveyed in a migration or transfer certificate and can be presented to the requesting institution to fulfil their requirements.

According to the Guidelines for Pursuing Two Academic Programmes Simultaneously, issued by University Grants Commission, New Delhi, circulated vide D.O.No. 1-6/2007(CPP-II)(New) Dated 13/4/2022 the Academic Council and Syndicate of Veer Narmad South Gujarat University, Surat has resolved to implement the policy of Pursuing Two Academic Programmes Simultaneously.

Since the policy allows a student to pursue two full-time academic programmes simultaneously, **the students now can take admission to another Higher Education Institution without leaving one Higher Education Institution**, to facilitate this provision, Veer Narmad South Gujarat University, Surat has discontinued the provision of issuing Transfer Certificates and Migration Certificates to any of the student.

It is the sole responsibility of the student to abide by the UGC Guidelines for Pursuing Two Academic Programmes Simultaneously and by the rules and regulations of the Higher Education Institution concerned where the student takes admission without hiding any facts.

All the Higher Education Institutions are requested to give admissions to the students of Veer Narmad South Gujarat University without Transfer Certificates and Migration Certificates.

It is advisable for the Higher Education Institution concerned to check and verify the genuineness of the mark sheets or degree certificate either through the National Academic Depository or by sending the copies of documents of the students and get them verified as per the verification policy of Veer Narmad South Gujarat University, Surat.

Subject: Implementation of UGC Guidelines on pursuing two academic programmes simultaneously

आदरणीय महोदया/महोदय,

As you are aware, the UGC issued guidelines permitting students to pursue two academic programs simultaneously on 13 April 2022. Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) were requested to establish mechanisms through their statutory bodies to facilitate students to avail of the opportunity, as outlined in UGC letters dated 30 September 2022 and 10 January 2023. Copies of these letters are enclosed.

It has come to the UGC's attention that many students continue to face challenges in enrolling in two academic programs at the same time, primarily due to HEIs' insistence on the submission of migration certificates or school leaving certificates for admission. This requirement limits students' ability to secure admission to two programmes and undermines the purpose of the guidelines.

More than two years have elapsed since the issuance of the guidelines, and despite several reminders from the UGC, some universities are yet to facilitate the implementation of these guidelines.

HEIs are once again urged to create supportive mechanisms through their statutory bodies to ensure compliance with UGC's guidelines for pursuing two academic programs simultaneously.

Guidelines for Pursuing Two Academic Programmes Simultaneously

Background

The National Education Policy - NEP 2020 states that pedagogy must evolve to make education more experiential, holistic, integrated, inquiry-driven, discovery-oriented, learner-centred, discussion-based, flexible, and, of course, enjoyable. The policy envisions imaginative and flexible curricular structures to enable creative combinations of disciplines for study, that would offer multiple entry and exit points, thus, removing currently prevalent rigid boundaries and creating new possibilities for life-long learning and centrally involve critical and interdisciplinary thinking.

With the rapid increase in demand for higher education and limited availability of seats in regular stream, several Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) have started a number of programmes in Open and Distance Learning (ODL) mode to meet the aspirations of students. It has also led to the emergence of online education programmes which a student can pursue within the comforts of her / his home. The issue of allowing the students to pursue two academic programmes simultaneously has been examined by the Commission keeping in view the proposals envisaged in the National Education Policy - NEP 2020 which emphasizes the need to facilitate multiple pathways to learning involving both formal and non-formal education modes.

In view of above, UGC has framed the following Guidelines.

Objectives

To allow the students to pursue two academic programmes simultaneously keeping in view the following objectives envisaged in NEP 2020:

- recognizing, identifying, and fostering the unique capabilities of each student, by sensitizing teachers as well as parents to promote each student's holistic development in both academic and non-academic spheres;
- no hard separations between arts and sciences, between curricular and extra-curricular activities, between vocational and academic streams, etc. in order to eliminate harmful hierarchies among, and silos between different areas of learning;

- multidisciplinary and a holistic education across the sciences, social sciences, arts, humanities, and sports for a multidisciplinary world in order to ensure the unity and integrity of all knowledge;
- enabling an individual to study one or more specialized areas of interest at a deep level, and also develop character, ethical and constitutional values, intellectual curiosity, scientific temper, creativity, spirit of service.
- offering the students, a range of disciplines including sciences, social sciences, arts, humanities, languages, as well as professional, technical, and vocational subjects to make them thoughtful, well-rounded, and creative individuals.
- preparing students for more meaningful and satisfying lives and work roles and enable economic independence.

Guidelines

1. A student can pursue two full time academic programmes in physical mode provided that in such cases, class timings for one programme do not overlap with the class timings of the other programme.
2. A student can pursue two academic programmes, one in full time physical mode and another in Open and Distance Learning (ODL)/Online mode; or up to two ODL/Online programmes simultaneously.
3. Degree or diploma programmes under ODL/Online mode shall be pursued with only such HEIs which are recognized by UGC/Statutory Council/Govt. of India for running such programmes.
4. Degree or diploma programmes under these guidelines shall be governed by the Regulations notified by the UGC and also the respective statutory/professional councils, wherever applicable.
5. These guidelines shall come into effect from the date of their notification by the UGC. No retrospective benefit can be claimed by the students who have already done two academic programmes simultaneously prior to the notification of these guidelines.

The above guidelines shall be applicable only to the students pursuing academic programmes other than Ph.D. programme.

Based on the above guidelines, the universities can devise mechanisms, through their statutory bodies, for allowing their students to pursue two academic programmes simultaneously as mentioned above.

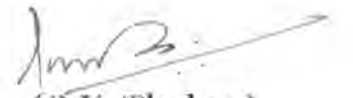
As you are aware, UGC has issued guidelines on 13.04.2022 for pursuing two academic programme simultaneously wherein UGC has allowed a student to pursue two academic programmes simultaneously. Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) were requested to implement these guidelines for the benefit of the students. Also your attention is invited to UGC letter dated 30.09.2022 wherein universities were requested to devise a mechanism through their Statutory Bodies that could facilitate the students to pursue two academic programmes simultaneously.

It has come to the notice of the UGC that students are facing difficulties as HEIs insist on migration certificates / School Leaving Certificate. In the absence of these certificates, the students are not granted admission and that defeats the facility of pursuing two academic programmes simultaneously.

It is, therefore, once again requested that the universities may kindly devise facilitative mechanisms through their statutory bodies to allow the students to pursue two academic programmes simultaneously.
