Ms. Vaishali Kharva presented on “Population Pyramid relationship with Labour Force Participation Rate in India from 1951-2011.” Her presentation analyzed demographic trends and their implications for workforce planning, economic productivity, and social development, with UNWPP 2027 population Pyramid.
