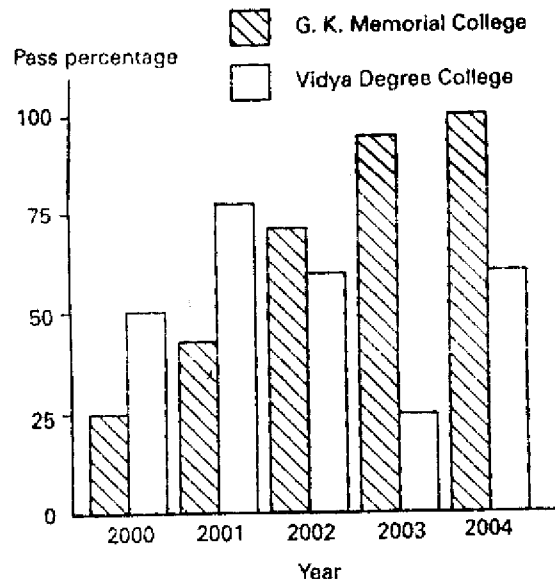

There are three conditions that must be met for a piece of writing to be libel. First the writing must be defamatory, causing injury to someone's reputation or degrading him in the eyes of people. Second, the writing must be about a person who is identifiable. Even when the person is not named in the report, the context can sometimes identify her. Third, the material must be published, that is, communicated to someone other than the offended person. If you write defamatory remarks about someone in your private diary, there is no libel. If however, the diary reaches another person's hand even by chance, it will be considered that the material has been published, and you may be sued. Selling even a single copy of a book containing libellous material, and reading it to another person will be treated as publication of such material.
