What is the place of religion in education ? Good values and moral caliber are indispensable for social security and progress. One major aim of education is to help the individual realise his true self. Ours is a democratic society in which we try to practice equality, liberty and fraternity. Respect for others and their way of life, tolerance of different religions and their practice of it, cooperation, participation and moral integrity are the forces that add strength to the social structure. Individual excellence and group progress are to be the goals. It is well - known that religion as a strengthening and unifying force can help to achieve these laudable goals. School is the place where religion and education should go together to make youth help develop positively and in the best way possible.

India's society and culture and every aspect of life are inextricably interwoven with religion. Religion and education cannot be separated here. The day begins with morning prayer and it ends with another prayer. But history shows that where other countries invaded India and brought her under their political suzerainty, education and religion were the casualties. The policy of divide and rule was followed by the British to keep the Indias under their control. The term 'religion' was used for creating intolerance and hatred among the several communities in India, who were already divided by language, caste and class. The consequence was a legacy of mistrust and rejection of all that is good in religion. The reaction of religion has been so strong that any effort to give proper recognition to religion in education is looked at with doubt and mistrust. Advocates of the antireligious group expressed that moral and spiritual values could be taught to youth without

advocating any religion. But in practice, we find that education without religion is soulless and utterly materialistic. Throughout her history India has been strengthened by its culture and religion. But today our nation is on the verge of a culture crisis as a result of education which is merely utilitarian.
