- On August 15, 1947, I took charge of the office of Chief Justice of Bombay from Sir Leonard Stone. I was the first Indian to be Chief Justice, and I fully realised the weight of my responsibilities. The Bombay High Court had a long line of distinguished Chief Justices, and had very high traditions as one of the premier High Courts of India. When I took office, I offered a prayer that I would have the capacity to maintain those traditions, and that when I retired it should not be said of me that I had in any way lowered them or had not proved worthy of them. Whether my prayer was answered or not, it is for others to judge. I can honestly claim that during my eleven-year tenure as Chief Justice, I gave to the High Court all the dedication and devotion of which I was capable. My thoughts day and night were all centred around the High Court. During the whole of that period I do not think I absented myself from court even once. I have sat when I had fever, I have sat when I had a violent attack of gout, and when I was sick or sorry. I believed that when the court was sitting my place was there.
