SOCIOLOGY OF TRIBAL INDIA

Objectives

The tribal folks constitute a significant segment of Indian society. The aim of this paper is to provide a comprehensive understanding of tribal people in terms of their distribution and concentration, demographic feature, social structure and cultural patterns with the help of illustration from tribal society in India and Gujarat.
