**Objectives:**

1. To understand basic psychological concepts applied in social work profession.
2. To develop a working knowledge of Psychology's content domains and applications of psychology in Everyday life as well as Social Work Profession.

**Outcome:**

The understanding of basic psychological concepts and theories will help students in social work practices.
